Silver Wolf Band is a four-piece Indigenous folk pop rock band from Happy Valley Goose Bay, Labrador. Lively, engaging and self-assured performances of honest and sincere lyrical music is what has made Silver Wolf Band one of the most in-demand music groups from Labrador. Their music is shaped and informed by family, community, love, and their homeland itself. Their first full length album saw them nominated for Rock Artist of the Year (Music NL, 2018) and First Light Indigenous Artist/Group of the Year (Music NL, 2019). Their second full length album "Storms & Prayers" won them First Light Indigenous Artist of the Year (Music NL) 2020). Silver Wolf Band is Jamie Jackman, Matthew Barrett, Justin Jackman, and Brandon Pardy. They are coming off a successful provincial tour in support of Storms & Prayers that had sold out shows in St. John's, Corner Brook, their hometown of Happy Valley-Goose Bay, and Wesleyville.


